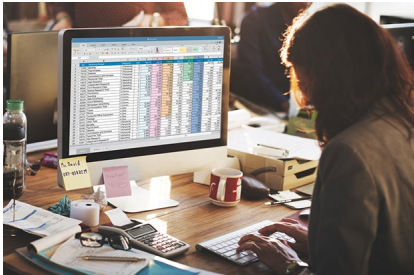

The term “LMI” encompasses a wide range of quantitative and qualitative data that relate to employment and the workforce. It can be challenging to know which data sources to use for different situations and what the strengths and limitations are of different types of workforce information.
